General Tips for Preventing Water Damage in Your Home

Periodically check for hidden leaks in the main water line feeding your home:

- 1. Turn off all faucets and water using appliances.
- 2. Record your water meter reading
- 3. Wait 15 minutes (be sure not to flush any toilets during that time.
- 4. Check the water meter again.

If the flow indicator is spinning, or the meter reading has changed although you have used no water, you may have a leak in your water main or irrigation system, or you may have a faulty toilet flush mechanism. Time to call a plumber!

HUD/FHA Modernization Bill

(Washington, D.C.) Earlier this year the House Committee on Financial Services introduced HR 1852, the Expanding American Homeownership Act of 2007. This bill strives to modernize HUD/FHA and facilitate more home sales using FHA financing. Some goals of this bill are:

- 1. to provide flexibility to FHA to allow for the insurance of housing loans for low- and moderate-income homebuyers during all economic cycles in the mortgage market;
- 2. to modernize the FHA single family mortgage insurance program by making it more reflective of enhancements to loan-level risk assessments and changes to the mortgage market; and
- 3. to adjust the loan limits for the single family mortgage insurance program to reflect rising house prices and the increased costs associated with new construction.

The modernization bill would establish certain borrower protections, including mortgage disclosures and mortgagor counseling, as mandatory for higher risk mortgages.
